Culture Box- UK and India:



The British Council, the Indian High Commission and the UK government officially launched the UK-India Year of Culture on 27 February 2017 in a glittering ceremony at the Buckingham Palace. Celebrating the long-standing relationship between the UK and India, the UK-India Year of Culture saw cultural events, exhibitions and activities taking place in both countries throughout 2017. Audiences had the chance to experience innovative and exciting creative work from some of the best UK and Indian companies, artists and institutions. We were privileged to participate in an exciting online competition showcasing the strong ties between India and UK schools.

The competition: As part of Connecting Classrooms, International School Award and Schools Online projects we have collaborated with schools in the UK-virtually as well as face-to-face. What impact has our interaction with the UK school had on our school and classroom pedagogy and practice? How has it impacted students? How has the partnership grown over the years? Thinking of these areas, we were asked to create a catchy phrase (not more than six words) on what does the UK-India Year of Culture mean to us? We were asked to top up our phrase with a supporting high resolution photograph (minimum 2 MB size) showcasing the bonding between UK-India students. The photograph included actual visits undertaken by the staff and sharing of work between students of both the countries and even an online interaction between them.

Numerous schools across India had submitted beautiful depictions and portrayals of their collaborative work with their UK partner school. The pictures tell us how well we have been able to imbibe and exchange UK and Indian cultures amongst our students, both from our school as well as our partner school.

We are extremely glad that out of 150+ entries received from schools all over India our school's entry has been shortlisted as one of the 20 best entries.

Study India Programme by Indogenius Group for students from different universities of Australia.

Around 50 students from various universities of Australia once again visited our school on **Monday,13th November'2017** as a part of the 'Study India Programme'. Based on the success of the past programmes and the feedback received from the students, Team Indogenius has selected our school for the visit.

The visit included:
